# **Professor Dr Wolfgang Greiner**

Member of the Council of Experts for the Assessment of Developments in the Health Care System; Chair of Health Economics and Health Management at the University of Bielefeld

Professor Dr Wolfgang Greiner has been a member of the Council of Experts for the Assessment of Developments in the Health Care System at the Federal Ministry of Health since mid-2010. Since April 2005, he has held the chair for Health Economics and Health Management at the University of Bielefeld. Wolfgang Greiner is also on the scientific advisory boards of the following organizations: the statutory health insurance funds Barmer, DAK and Techniker as well as the Institute for Quality and Efficiency in Health Care (IQWiG). In 2019, he was appointed as a non-partisan member of the Medical Evaluation Committee. He is a member of the editorial boards of the journals PharmacoEconomics, Health Economics Review and Gesundheitsökonomie & Qualitätsmanagement. His scientific focus is on the evaluation of health services, quality-of-life research, health technology assessment, risk structure compensation and disease management.

#### Professor Dr Georg Marckmann, MPH

Director of the Institute of Ethics, History and Theory of Medicine, Ludwig Maximilians University Munich

Professor Dr Georg Marckmann studied medicine and philosophy at the University of Tübingen and completed a degree in public health at Harvard University in Boston. From 1998 to 2010, he worked at the Institute of Ethics and History at the University of Tübingen and habilitated in "Ethics in Medicine". Since 2010, he has been Professor of Ethics, History and Theory of Medicine and the Director of the Institute of the same name at the Ludwig Maximilians University of Munich. As President of the Academy for Ethics in Medicine, he is involved in various institutions such as the Central Ethics Commission of the German Medical Association (BÄK), the Ethics Commission of the Medical Association of Baden-Württemberg and as Chairman of the Health Council Southwest.

### Professor Dr Dr Kerstin Vokinger

Assistant Professor of Public Law and Digitization, Health Law and Regulatory Sciences, University of Zurich

Professor Dr. Dr. Kerstin Vokinger studied law and medicine at the University of Zurich. She holds a PhD in both disciplines and works as an Assistant Professor for Public Law and Digitalization, Health Law and Regulatory Sciences at the University of Zurich. In addition, she completed a Master of Law (LL.M.) at Harvard Law School. In her research, Vokinger focuses on interdisciplinary issues at the interface of law, medicine and technology. She also advises international organizations and authorities.
